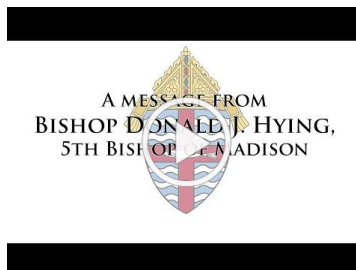

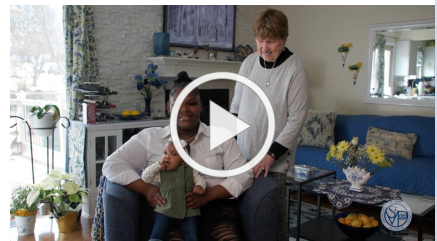

Rapid Rehousing Update

SVdP remains committed to helping our homeless Neighbors! Since January 2022, we have received 8 referrals. Seven of those are currently working with St. Patrick Center. We welcome referrals from Jefferson County, St. Francois County, Ste. Genevieve County and St. Louis City and County! Eligible Neighbors must:

- have a dependent
- be homeless for less than 30 days or be at imminent risk of homelessness
- have some form of income or the ability to obtain some form of income.

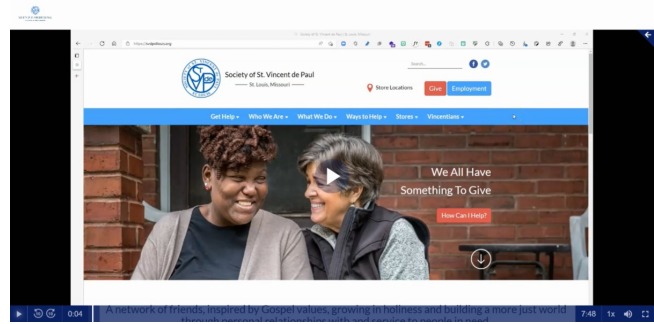

Vincentian Meditation

Won't You Be My Neighbor?

"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." – Matthew 22:37-39

Over the last few years, we have made an important shift in how we refer to those we serve. Following Christ's (and Mister Rogers') example, we use the term "Neighbor in Need" or, simply, "Neighbor." This is an expression of our Essential Element of Friendship.

We refrain from referring to Neighbors as clients (or NINs). Clients don't have clients, but Neighbors have Neighbors. A Vincentian-client relationship is one-directional. A Neighbor-Neighbor relationship, on the other hand, flows both ways. We seek to be and see the face of Christ in our engagements with our Neighbors, and we, in turn, grow as Vincentians. It is a mutually beneficial exchange.

Volunteer Story: Lighting the Way

It's a common problem with donated items – some people give items that aren't so gently used. In particular, the Christy store was stocked with dozens of candles with wicks that were already burned.

But instead of throwing away these used candles, SVdP Volunteers Terri Philippi and Ed Mantia saw an opportunity. Back in 2015, Ed proposed collecting old candles, melting them down, giving them new wicks, and returning them to the store in their new, useable conditions.

"It takes about two days to make a candle," says Terri. "But it's very relaxing!"

The first time that they melted and recreated candles for the Christy store, Ed and Terri set out 186 candles. All of them sold, and fast. Their candles were in high demand!

Now, they sort through donated candles, looking for ones that have been used but are still in good enough condition to be melted down. From there, they're sorted into scented, unscented, and holiday varieties. Around Christmas time, Ed and Terri set out their refurbished Christmas candles for SVdP customers.

By making new candles out of old wax, Ed and Terri are keeping candles out of the landfill, and giving Neighbors in Need a thoughtful product, made with care.

"When it comes to donations, don't donate something that's broken or doesn't work. Treat others like you'd want to be treated," says Terri.

The time they spend making candles is filled with music and conversation—but the hours also earn them credit for vouchers for our Neighbors in Need.

Missouri Bill Could Roll Back Medicaid Expansion

In August 2020, Missouri voters approved a constitutional amendment that extended Medicaid eligibility to adults earning up to 138% of the Federal Poverty Level. For example, a single adult earning up to \$17,774 annually is now eligible, as are adults in a family of four earning up to \$36,576 annually. These adults were previously ineligible for both Medicaid and subsidized healthcare through the Marketplace.
