Dear Vincentians.

For the past few weeks – The Board of Directors has been receiving information regarding "Words" – how important it is for all of us - St. Vincent de Paul Archdiocesan Council, our District Councils and Conferences to use the same "words" to describe the good works that are an addition to their basic structure.

For Example: The St. Louis Archdiocesan Council has 9 stores – these are "Special Works" and are defined as such for all Councils. There are some Conferences that have established Food Pantries which are also classified as "Special Works".

We have "**programs**" – which have been approved by the Board of Directors and are elements inside the stores such as the Bed Program and Voucher program. These defined programs are used by all Vincentians to give direct assistance to our Neighbors in Need.

(In the coming months, all of our programs will be reviewed by the Board of Directors)

Lastly, who are we? The Board of Directors is the St. Louis Archdiocesan Council and we are fortunate to have a "Council Office" led by our Executive Director and staff who collaborate with the Board of Directors and with you, to help our Neighbors in Need.

When your Conference fills out the CAR (report), the St. Louis Archdiocesan Council also submits a report which is sent to the National Office therefore, your accuracy flows into that report.

I am attaching the Rule: part III, Statute 20 or if you need more information, I am always available to you.

To be deductible, the donation must be made to a qualifying organization (such as SVdP) and cannot be set aside for a specific Neighbor. Vincentian Meditation

In June, according to the Vincentian Manual, all Vincentian Conferences and Councils are instructed to make a Consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This act of Consecration may be unknown to many, or seem from another time, especially with the language it is written in. However, it gets at the heart of Vincentian spirituality: Divine Charity or Divine Love.

Divine Love, as known through Christian faith in Jesus Christ, is the animating and unifying force of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. It is centered in our experience as a Eucharistic people from whom loving communion with the heart of Jesus is a living reality. We desire to share that love, like our Lord, with those most in need of it.

Indeed, inspired by the love of the heart of Jesus we offer the love of his heart to others as a healing balm, for emancipation from evils, in friendship, for the good of our communities. As many Vincentians have learned, when we offer Christ's love, we receive it back even more, especially in the poor and suffering.

In the Church, June is traditionally devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Typically, the Consecration to the Sacred Heart is prayed by a Conference in June.

What is most important, is the deeper meaning that underlies this prayer, that the Society is renewed spiritually by intentionally committing to and increasing communion with the loving heart of Jesus.

The Consecration Prayer to the Sacred Heart is provided below. **For a downloadable copy click here.**

Act of Consecration to the Sacred Heart

Lord Jesus, Who, seeing the cold indifference of the world and in order to revive charity amongst all people, has unveiled before them Your Sacred Heart and revealed the infinite riches of Your Divine Love, behold us prostrate before You, we who form only one Family, by the bond of fraternal charity, scattered, it is true, throughout the world, but united under the standard of St. Vincent de Paul, and forming only one body and one soul in the common spirit of the apostolate of charity; we dedicate and consecrate to Your Divine Person and to Your Sacred Heart this our Council (or Conference), and all the members who compose it, the poor whom we visit in Your name, the youth and children to whom we respond in order to maintain them in Your service; in a word, all those of whom we have the care, and all the works we have undertaken in various places for Your Glory. Quite unworthy though we are, we beseech You to receive this offering in the odor of sweetness; inflame us with that fire which from the depths of Your Heart You desire to see burning more and more each day, in order that, filled with the tenderness of Your Heart, we may learn to despise things here below, to love and help our neighbor, by word and example, and that, among the vicissitudes of this world, we may fix our hearts on the riches and happiness that shall never end. Amen.

(This act of consecration is to be renewed annually by all units of the Society.)

From the Voice of the Poor Committee

Join the Credit Empowerment Team



As Vincentians, we encounter Neighbors in Need who are unable to pay their bills because they are trapped in excessively high-interest loans, such as payday, car title, and high-cost small installment loans. Two recent examples include a Neighbor who was paying \$1,501 in interest on a \$700 loan and another paying \$4,830 in


interest on a \$2,110 loan.

Last September, the Board of Directors of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Archdiocesan Council of St. Louis (SVdP), authorized the formation of a Task Force to advance the establishment of a Credit Empowerment Pilot Program similar to programs in ten other Councils. In the pilot, SVdP would partner with a financial institution who would (1) convert the Neighbor's existing high-interest loan to a low-interest loan secured by a SVdP deposit account, and (2) coach the Neighbor on credit and money management with the goal of improving the Neighbor's credit opportunities.

Once the Task Force has fully defined the pilot, the Board will vote on final approval of its launch. In the meantime, a key activity of the Task Force is to build a Credit Empowerment Team: a team of approximately eight volunteers with financial backgrounds who will complete a budget with the Neighbor, assess the Neighbor's ability to repay a low-interest loan, and walk qualifying Neighbors through the loan process. The Housing Situation in Missouri



As Vincentians, we daily encounter Neighbors in Need who struggle to keep a roof over their heads. The housing statistics for our Archdiocese and for Missouri as a whole underscore this struggle:

In the Archdiocese of St. Louis:

- The HUD fair market rate for a modest 2-bedroom rental ranges from \$662 in less populated areas to \$938 in the greater St. Louis metro.
- The income needed to afford a modest 2-bedroom rental ranges from \$26,480 annually (\$12.73 hourly) to \$37,520 annually (\$18.04 hourly).
- 1.2 to 1.8 full-time jobs at minimum wage are needed to afford a modest 2-bedroom rental.¹

In Missouri:

- 345,000 low-income Missouri renters pay over half their income in rent. Rent is considered unaffordable if it costs more than 30% of a household's income. These Missourians must often forgo other necessities like food and medicine in order to remain housed.
- 34,030 Missouri schoolchildren live in unstable housing—on the street, in shelters, with other families, or in motels.
- 6,530 Missourians experienced homelessness on a single night in 2020.²
