St. Vincent de Paul and Archdiocese Partner to Meet Rising Needs in the Community

IN A YEAR marked by extraordinary need and generosity, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul – Archdiocesan Council of St. Louis emerged as a vital focus of community support. Amid rising inflation, surging rent costs, and an escalating affordable housing crisis, St. Vincent de Paul continues to serve as a critical safety net for our Neighbors in Need—offering hope, stability, and compassion to those facing hardship.

This year, the Society received a boost through a special allocation from the 2024 Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA), which celebrated its 70th anniversary. While the ACA traditionally supports a wide range of ministries, Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski and campaign leadership recognized the urgent needs of the St. Vincent de Paul and extended this special support.

Executive Director John Foppe expressed deep appreciation:

"This gift comes at a crucial time for St. Vincent de Paul. We strive every day to keep people housed, and I am deeply grateful to Archbishop Rozanski, the ACA, and the entire St. Louis Catholic community for their generous response."

The ACA, led this year by Chair Michael Heck, raised funds to benefit ministries across the Archdiocese—including parish support, youth ministry, clergy care, and outreach to those in need.

AFTER MONTHS of living out of her car and hotel rooms with her four children, Alexandra has found a new path forward thanks to the support of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP) and two dedicated volunteers. Her journey from homelessness to stability is a testament to the power of community support and determination.

At her lowest point, Alexandra reached out to churches in her area, seeking any assistance available. One call led her to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, where she connected with John Heithaus and Michael Cunningham. The two Vincentians quickly responded, arranging for a home visit to assess her needs.

Their help could not have come at a more critical time. In addition to facing homelessness, Alexandra was struggling with an eviction on her record, which made finding suitable housing nearly impossible. Recognizing the urgency of her situation, the Vincentians secured funding for Alexandra to stay temporarily at the St. Patrick Center, giving her and her children a safe place to regroup.

Two local St. Vincent de Paul Conferences — Sacred Heart and Holy Name of Jesus — joined forces to provide further support. John Heithaus went above and beyond, personally reaching out to potential landlords to advocate for Alexandra despite her eviction history. His persistence paid off, helping to open doors that had previously been closed. Reflecting on the support she received, Alexandra expressed deep gratitude. "One of the things I most appreciated was that they always saw me as a person — they didn't see color or gender, just someone who was trying to do better in life and needed a little help," she said.

Her story took a positive turn as she found housing for herself and her two younger children. Determined to build a better future, Alexandra has since enrolled in a training program to become an EMT. Along the way, she has also formed lasting friendships with the Vincentian volunteers who assisted her. She and John Heithaus often exchange prayer requests for friends



and family, maintaining a bond that continues to provide spiritual and emotional support.

John Heithaus spoke warmly of Alexandra's perseverance. "Lending a hand to people like Alexandra is where we, as Vincentians, can really become the face of Christ," he said. "There is nothing more joyful than seeing her or any of our Neighbors succeed. She was working hard and doing all the right things, and now with just a little help from St. Vincent de Paul, she has her life in good order."
