Tidbits from Elizabeth Barbieri

I thought I'd share a bit of SVdP history with you today.

The Mullanphy Traveler's Aid began in 1851 when Bryan Mullanphy, one of our SVdP founders of the First US Conference, as well as a former mayor of St. Louis and philanthropist, gave \$500,000 (worth \$16,525,449 today) to the City of St. Louis to assist "bona fide travelers heading west." It is



said to be "the oldest, non-sectarian social welfare movement in the United States." The Traveler's Aid that Bryan Mullanphy created was imitated throughout the country.

In May, 2018, Mullanphy Travelers Aid closed in St. Louis. Thank you Vincentian Bryan Mullanphy for what you did for the destitute and the poor struggling to start a new life and build a home somewhere in our country for almost 200 years.

Housing Amid the COVID-19 Economic
Crisis

"Support Incentives for Affordable Housing" is one of our legislative priorities. There is a lack of affordable housing nationwide (in every state).

The Harvard University's Joint Center for Housing Studies 2019 State of the Nation's Housing Report shows:

- Nearly 38 million households nationwide 31.5% of all households are paying **more than 30% of their incomes** on housing, which equates to 20.5 million renters and 17.3 million homeowners.
- More than 18 million households 1 in 6 are payingmore than half of their income on housing and are considered severely cost-burdened. The largest share of these households includes 9.5 million renters earning less than \$30,000 per year and 5.4 million homeowners earning less than \$30,000.

The COVID-19 crisis has exacerbated the need for affordable housing. Following is a link that explores strategies, both present and future, that can help reduce the number of households that lack access to good-quality affordable housing.
