A Message from John Foppe

Dear Vincentian Friends,

This past year has truly felt like "the perfect storm," bringing cash flow challenges to the Council. A significant bequest was depleted faster than expected as we focused on serving the poor, and changes in the thrift industry, combined with rising inflation, wage increases, and staff turnover, compounded the situation.

However, we've weathered the storm. Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we surpassed our FY24 fundraising goal, raising more than \$3 million. The SVdP Board approved the FY25 budget on September 26, ensuring continued resources for those in need.

Updates:

- The FY25 budget will prioritize essentials like beds and donated goods. A new grant model will begin in early 2025, supporting Conferences with limited resources.
- The Voice for the Poor Committee is considering expanding the credit empowerment program, and has applied for outside grants to do so.
- A new Committee for Vincentian Vocation and Vitality will focus on nurturing our Vincentian spirituality.
- We continue to support parish realignments through "All Things New."
- SVdP USA is rolling out "Vision SVdP," with National President John Berry encouraging all to participate in Listening Sessions.
- Our Council is planning the Spring Assembly for April 26, 2025—save the date!
- In FY24, we hosted 32 formation and training events and provided support to Conferences in need.
- Our Council includes over 3,000 Vincentians. We are one mission with many hands.

Moving Forward:

- Our accounting team is nearly complete, and financials are being delivered.
- We are optimizing resources in our stores to increase revenue. For example, expanding our clothing section in Creve Coeur has already boosted sales.
- Our fundraising goal for next year is to raise again nearly \$3 million .
- Outside auditors have recommended improvements to Conference Accounting, and we will provide updates soon.
- All Vincentians must comply with the Archdiocese's "Safeguarding God's Children" requirements. Visit www.preventandprotectstl.org to ensure your records are up to date.
- ServWare has proven beneficial for Conference and Neighbor reporting, and we encourage all Conferences to use it.

Although this year has been challenging, we have made progress, and things are turning around. Throughout our 180-year history, we've faced tough times and emerged stronger. Our pillars of spirituality, friendship, and service remain our foundation. With your dedication to the mission, we will continue to make a meaningful impact in the lives of those we serve.

As Isaiah 25:4 reminds us, "You have been a refuge for the poor, a refuge for the needy in their distress, a shelter from the storm." Thank you for everything you do. You are the heart and soul of SVdP, and I am deeply grateful for your dedication and support

Safeguarding Requirements for Vincentians

If you completed the Protecting God's Children program for your parish, the CYC, or your school 10, 15, or even 20 years ago—thank you! This program, which began in 2003, has since expanded to cover all vulnerable individuals. In 2020, the Archdiocese added two new components: Mandated Reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct.

All three components are now required for Active and Associate Vincentians, and it's important that everyone stays compliant.

You can easily check your records and schedule any necessary training by visiting the Prevent & Protect website: https://www.preventandprotectstl.org/. Use the same Username and Password from your Protecting God's Children account or create a new one if needed. When registering for the first time, use the password: stlprotect.

Once logged in, scroll down to the "MY TRAINING" box. Click "Completed" to find the dates when you finished each part of the required training and print your certificates. If you need to complete a component, click "Due." The sessions are short and can be done online from the comfort of your home.

One Mission, Many HandsConference Spotlight - St. Ann in Normandy



Saint Ann Conference in Normandy

The Vincentians of St. Ann's Conference in Normandy recently stepped up to support a family of five in desperate need. After surviving an abusive relationship and a devastating house fire that destroyed all their belongings, the family spent five difficult months seeking shelter with relatives, friends, and even living in their car. When they finally saved enough for a deposit and monthly rent on a house within the St. Ann Conference area, they found themselves in a home large enough for their needs but lacking essential furniture, appliances, and air conditioning.

With temperatures soaring into the 90s, St. Ann's Vincentians immediately secured a window AC unit through the Council to bring some relief. They also provided vouchers for furniture and

clothing, and the conference purchased and delivered a stove and refrigerator to make the home more livable. When the family needed beds, St. Ann's reached out to the Disaster Relief Committee, which generously provided five beds for the children and parents.

In a follow-up visit, St Ann's Vincentians were heartened to see the family beginning to regain a sense of normalcy. With most of their immediate needs met, the family was well on their way to recovery, with only a washer and dryer remaining to be purchased.

Thanks to the dedication of the St. Ann Conference, this family has been able to rebuild their lives with dignity and hope.

This is a great example of the Society working together as one. We are one mission, many hands!

Updates

Hello, Vincentians!

As we are about to complete FY24 and to begin FY25, I wanted to provide a few Council updates I believe you'll find useful:

- 1. On September 26, your SVdP Board of Directors met for the last FY24 meeting. Most notably, the FY25 budget was passed which puts your Council on a plan to achieve success in the coming year.
- 2. This new FY25 budget allows for SVdP to switch to a grants model for Conferences in need of financial help to support Neighbors. These grants will be available in early 2025. The Executive Committee and the Program Committee will finalize the process, but the grants should:
- a. Require less Conference paperwork.
- b. Allow those closest to the need to determine the best way to help, as our Rule indicates.
- c. Create a more equitable fund distribution to Conferences with few resources.
- d. Manage expectations about the support Council can provide and can help Conferences budget appropriately.
- 3. As we close out this fiscal year, the Council will provide a limited supply of bed and donated goods vouchers to Districts before the end of October. There are no delivery vouchers, but Conferences can elect to pay for Neighbor delivery if needed.
- 4. Spring Assembly is scheduled for April 26, 2025. Please save the date.
- 5 All Things New mergers continue During FY24, the Council submitted Conference closure



paperwork to SVdP National for 24 former Conferences.

- 6. Our auditors have made suggestions for our Conference Activity Reports. These will be reviewed by SVdP's Finance Committee and District Presidents. Stay tuned for more information which will be sent to all Conference Presidents and Treasurers.
- 7. Please update your membership list and officer list in ServWare. This greatly helps record keeping.
- 8. We are changing the sales floor of some SVdP thrift stores to increase their profitability and to best support our mission. For example, the Christy Store is a "Buy-by-pound" Thrift Outlet and the Creve Coeur Store has an expanded clothing department.
- a. And going forward, SVdP will be more selective about donations to the stores to ensure they are quality items that provide our Neighbors and customers the best possible and dignified shopping experience.

Reminder: Conference Audits

In reviewing financial procedures across the St. Louis Council, it has come to our attention that we do not have a standard policy for conducting conference audits. The section titled "Accountability" in the Rule, and specifically Statute 27, state that audits are a part of maintaining fiscal integrity at all levels of the Society and that Council Presidents should require audits of conference's finances under their purview as deemed appropriate. This phrase deemed appropriate has caused much confusion and interpretation across the community. Therefore, we are establishing a policy floor for the conduct of audits.s

Within the St. Louis Council, audits will be required if there is a change of Presidents, a change of Treasurers or a lapse of one year since the last audit. Audits should be recorded on the enclosed form (Worksheet and Verification Form) and made part of the permanent Conference files as well as forwarding a copy to the applicable District President.

Who conducts the audit? At the Conference level, the audit may be conducted by:

- Two or more members of the conference who are not currently holding office.
- Two or more disinterested individuals who are members of the parish
- Two or more Vincentians from another Conference

The conference audit should be conducted in accordance with the Worksheet for Conference Audits. The completed Audit Verification Form should be forwarded to the District President and to Steve Rupp at stever@svdpstl.org

Credit Empowerment Can Be Life-Changing



The Credit Empowerment program is a Vincentian-run program that will:

- 1. Convert a Neighbor's high-interest loan(s) totaling \$3,000 or less to a Credit Empowerment loan at Midwest BankCentre with a rate of approximately 7%.
- 2. Provide financial mentoring periodically during the term of the Credit Empowerment loan.

To be eligible, a Neighbor must have monthly income that exceeds monthly expenses, once the low-interest payment replaces the high-interest.

Two Neighbor Stories:

- "Amanda" was injured in a car accident and temporarily unable to work. She took out a \$1,200 loan from an online tribal lender. She was expected to pay back \$6,428 over the course of 10 months. That's \$5,228 in interest on a \$1,200 loan. By converting to a Credit Empowerment loan, Amanda's interest dropped from \$5,228 to \$43.
- "Jake" took out a \$5,370 loan from a national car title lender. He was expected to pay back \$28,715 over the course of 4 years. That's \$23,345 in interest on a \$5,370 loan. Jake's loan was converted to a \$3,000 Credit Empowerment loan, with his Conference paying the balance over \$3,000. Jake is paying a total of \$155 in interest on his Credit Empowerment loan, compared to \$23,345 on his title loan.

What Can You Do?

- The most important first step is to ask the Neighbor on the home visit:
 "Do you have any high-interest loans? Because we have a program that might be able to help."
- If the Neighbor appears to be a candidate, the Conference completes a briefonline intake form and
 walks through the <u>list of documents</u> that the Neighbor must bring to the Credit Empowerment
 budgeting meeting.
- Two Credit Empowerment Team members—Vincentians with financial backgrounds—meet with the Neighbor to prepare a budget and determine ability to repay a Credit Empowerment loan.
- If eligible, the Credit Empowerment Team members accompany the Neighbor through the loan conversion at Midwest BankCentre and hold three financial mentoring sessions with the Neighbor.

St. Louise de Marillac suggested that "humility is the knowledge of truth."

Gentleness

Our gentleness is expressed through a friendly assurance and invincible goodwill, which mean kindness, sweetness, and patience in our relationship with others. St. Vincent reminds us that this must be both interior and exterior; in other words, we don't simply act patient and kind, we must truly be patient and kind!

Selflessness


Dying to our ego with a life of self-sacrifice; members share their time, their possessions, their talents and themselves in a spirit of generosity.

Zeal

Zeal, which St. Vincent once described as "the soul of all the virtues," is a passion for the full flourishing and eternal happiness of every person. We must be careful not to ever separate our zeal from our love of the neighbor, lest it become scolding, or what Bl. Frederic called "the proud pharisaism of an indiscreet zeal."


