We often speak of Servant Leadership as the unofficial fourth Essential Element of the Society. Following the life and example of Christ, leadership in the Society is not motivated by power, prestige, or material benefit. Rather, servant leadership is ordered to the good of those we serve.



Servant Leadership is especially important in the Society because we are structured like an upside-down pyramid. Our Neighbors are on top, followed by our Conferences/Vincentians, followed by our Council Office, and so on. The Rule calls Presidents to "provide an encouraging atmosphere in which the talents, capacities, and spiritual charism of the members are identified, developed, and put to the service of the poor and the Society of St. Vincent de Paul."

While Presidents have a special role to play, ALL Vincentians are called to servant leadership within their proper domains. We all have people we work with intimately, whether as part of our Vincentian life or beyond. And with all the pending changings coming as part of All Things New, we will need a great flowering of servant leadership to ensure the long-term flourishing of the Society and our Archdiocese.

Let us all officially embrace this unofficial Element and promote the good of those around us!

Important changes in SVdP's Thrift Store volunteer program

SVdP's Thrift Stores have benefited from the generous volunteer hours spent in our stores.

Recently, we have been made aware of implications to our volunteer program as outlined by the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA). The Act separates the roles of both employee and volunteer in a commercial enterprise such as our Thrift Stores. FLSA does not allow volunteers to replace the work of paid employees, even in non-profit commercial environment.
