As it was, we had brought two wheelchairs in our shipment, and, despite requests, we hadn't yet committed them to anyone. This boy was meant to have one.



So we drove him home along with a wheelchair, and I'm sure his situation will be be much improved (see photo with family).

Although I don't know the outcome, Mrs. Riley seemed to be grateful that I took the time to give her that information.

Urge Your Senators to Pass

The expanded Child Tax Credit (CTC) has been stuck in the Senate since January, when the House passed it with an overwhelming bipartisan majority.

It is critical that Senators pass the expanded CTC before it is too late.

The legislation would expand the CTC so that lower income children and families receive the full credit. The proposal prioritizes children whose families currently receive only a partial credit or no credit at all because their incomes are too low - approximately 16 million children will benefit from the expansion.

We have a narrow window to pass a strong Child Tax Credit bill. Inaction will kill the bill.

Please contact Senators Hawley and Schmitt and ask them to pass the Child Tax Credit bill now!



Benefits Cliff Update

Last year, the Missouri General Assembly passed legislation which would allow recipients of public assistance benefits (TANF, SNAP, and child care subsidies) to continue to receive benefits at a reduced rate if they took a pay raise or promotion, rather than being cut off altogether.

The point was to encourage work and help people out of poverty.

Although the Governor included money in his proposed budget to prepare state computer systems for the program, it was expected that the federal government would fund the benefits themselves.

In March, the federal government agencies that administer these programs told lawmakers that the language passed doesn't match federal requirements and that the state would have to fund the program with state general revenue. Lawmakers from both sides of the aisle are working with the federal agencies, along with the Governor's administration, to find a way to make this program a reality this year.

There is a federally-supported avenue for raising SNAP income and asset limits, called broad-based categorical eligibility, that 41 other states have implemented to provide reduced SNAP benefits above the current cliff at 130% of the Federal Poverty Level and/or to increase SNAP asset limits to encourage savings.

It is unclear if Missouri will opt for a broad-based categorical eligibility approach, but time is running out to find a solution this legislative session.
