outdoors.A St. Vincent de Paul Response

In response to the Supreme Court's decision in the City of Grants Pass, Oregon v. Johnson, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul expressed concerns by the decision and its impact on the homeless population going forward. By ruling in favor of the plaintiff, the Supreme Court has signaled that local governments can make it a crime for someone to live outside and unsheltered if they have no home. The Court's decision is a setback for unhoused people and communities nationwide working to solve homelessness. It is believed that this policy will only worsen homelessness.

What can we as Vincentians do to support our homeless Neighbors in Need? The Society of St. Vincent de Paul has successful homelessness prevention programs in place by providing rental assistance when needed along with other programs to help families have access to shelter. We must continue these programs, and in addition, we need to work on addressing the root causes of homelessness which includes that lack of affordable housing, address the backlog of people waiting for Section 8 housing vouchers and grow the number of landlords that are willing to accept them, and lastly, consider organizing Community Land Trusts (CLTs). A CLT is often managed by a non-profit that acquires multiple lots in a neighborhood and the trust uses grants or loans to acquire land. The CLT then sells homes and sometimes businesses at an affordable price. This is a tool that can be used to combat gentrification in neighborhoods that can result in displacement of low-income families. Access to affordable housing continues to be an acute need across America and the current decision by the Supreme Court is a call for Vincentians to have increased focus and attention on working to address the root causes of homelessness.

Various September Dates




This partnership helps support pregnant women during and after their pregnancy.

Vincentian Meditation



What are the benefits of Conferences meeting regularly?

"Manual 2.1 Conference...Conference Meetings: Conference meetings are privileged occasions during which members manifest Christ's love to one another and experience his healing presence. Conferences meet regularly and frequently, at least twice a month, in celebration of mutual friendship and out of a passion to serve the Lord.

Unlike other organizations within and outside the Church, the Conference meets less to conduct business than to celebrate and deepen its unity for essentially spiritual reasons. Opening and Closing Prayers, together with the Vincentian spiritual reflections, heighten our awareness of the Holy

Spirit's presence."

Meeting only once a month lessens the ability to achieve the spiritual and fraternal components mentioned in the Rule and Manual. And, if a Neighbor needs help and the Vincentians helping them need to bring the case up to the members at the next Conference meeting, that Neighbor may have to wait 30 days before their case is reviewed.

Meeting at least twice a month and doing home visits have been standards from the Society's beginning.

These standards are why the Society has been around for 191 years.

Here's a quote from M. D'Hendecourt, SVDP President-General, 1915, "Thus the Society of Vincent de Paul was constituted a charitable society: charitable in the widest meaning of the Term—loving God and one's neighbour. Hence the association of prayer and good works which is the characteristic of our meetings and our visits to the poor. This is so true that no one may be an active member except on condition that he attends the meetings and visits the poor. The most praiseworthy works, such as the patronages, cannot dispense from this condition. Presidents and members of Councils must also satisfy this condition."

How beautifully written. And how rewarding when these conditions are satisfied.
