SVdP St. Louis Council Update

Dear Vincentians:

As we have previously shared, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul in St. Louis has experienced cash flow challenges brought on by many factors: a quickerthan-anticipated spend-down of bequest monies, rising costs due to inflation, retail staffing challenges, and a turnover of the accounting finance department. Your St. Louis Council is remedying the matters we are facing. In the meantime, to help ensure financial stability and liquidity, the Board of Directors approved the closing of the Cool Valley Thrift Outlet and Processing Center, effective immediately. The staff was notified Monday.

Regrettably, further changes were made at the Council Office. The following positions have been eliminated:

- o Marketing Specialist, Luke Lindberg
- o Manager of Vincentian Data, John Doyle
- o Manager of Conference Growth and Revitalization, Tom Matoushek
- o Receptionist, Judi Webb

At the same time, Director of Stores, Mike Goering has decided to voluntarily resign his position. Mike will work with SVdP through the end of this week to assist in the transition. We are extremely grateful to Mike for his time with us and committment to the SVdP mission. We also feel much gratitude for those whose positions were elminated.

In addition to these changes, ALL blue donation bins located at parishes within the area will be discontinued. Pickups will begin the week of 7/15 and be completed by 7/31. Also, there will be changes in Council Programs, details will follow in future communications.

We understand that this news is disappointing. Collectively, we are grieving the shift in our organization. These decisions were not made lightly. We have considered all possible options, but ultimately, these actions are necessary to restore financial liquidity with St. Vincent de Paul of St. Louis and will position our organization with more strength in the future.

Thank you for your kindness to the SVdP St. Louis staff as they encounter a great change. We ask for your understanding and patience as we move forward. Please pray for those impacted by these changes.

SVdP in St. Louis is 179 years old. Despite these changes, we remain committed to serving and supporting our volunteer members and our Neighbors in Need, continuing His work to the best of our ability.

Society of St. Vincent de Paul Statement on Supreme Court Decision in Grant's Pass Vs. Gloria Johnson

The <u>Society of St. Vincent de Paul</u> expresses concern regarding the U.S. Supreme Court's decision in <u>*City of Grants Pass, Oregon v. Johnson*</u> By ruling in favor of the plaintiff, the Supreme Court has signaled that local governments can make it a crime for someone to live outside and unsheltered if they have no home.

"Reasonable people may and will disagree about this decision, but the fact of the matter is it doesn't get to the heart of the homelessness crisis," said John Berry, National President at Society of St. Vincent de Paul. "Neither stricter nor more lenient criminal laws sufficiently address the problem — which has vastly more to do with skyrocketing housing costs and inflation than it has to do with how local governments regulate homeless encampments."...





- Trucks...he negotiated a great deal on a truck for the North District to haul food, clothing and furniture to those in need. That truck was in Marty's funeral procession to Jefferson Barracks. A poignant picture was displayed at the tournament of the SVDP truck at Jefferson Barracks with the American flag in the background at half-staff.
- Golf...Marty started the North District Golf Tournament 11 years ago to raise awareness of SVDP, create friendships, and raise funds for the poor.

The golfers and sponsors came from all over the archdiocese to support this great cause. We had 36 teams with 144 golfers join us for a great day of golf! There were 60 gold, silver, and hole sponsors.
