Housing Reminders and Resources:

- The CDC halt on evictions is set to expire at the end of June. Nonprofits • across our region anticipate a surge in evictions and an onslaught of requests for financial assistance from our Neighbors.

Neighbors directly or indirectly impacted by COVID may be eligible for assistance. Due to the pandemic, the FCC is offering a temporary program to reduce the monthly cost of internet service to eligible households. Rapid Rehousing Update:

The Council Office has received 19 referrals from participating Conferences. Of these, 14 Neighbors have been accepted into the program and are working with St. Patrick Center. Six have been successfully rehoused or stabilized in their current housing. Six are looking for housing and 2 are in the screening process.

A Letter from Fr. Mark

Dear Vincentians,

May 1985 was one long month. It began late on April 30 during a call with my sort-of-recently widowed mother about her going to Mexico for laetrile treatments. Pancreatic cancer. For weeks I had offered to accompany her. No. On the eve of trip to Playas de Tijuana, yes.

United from Boston to Denver very early on May 1. Met Mom at gate of flight to San Diego. Bus to Mexico. Walked into clinic at 5 PM. May 3: Mom set-up. Home to

Boston. Daily calls. Mom perking up. Flowers delivered on May 10 for Mother's Day. Aunt Phyllis and Uncle Bill visit May 14 – 16.

May 19: she wasn't herself. Doctor says come. May 20 I arrive to take her home. She can't get out of bed. I stayed. May 22: forged her signature on her traveler's checks to pay for her care. May 23 worked from the pay phone. May 24 kept family informed. Closed a big sale that day. When, when? May 26 no. May 27 no. May 30 at 6:30 AM final kiss goodbye.

A nice man from the funeral home gets me and her cremains across the border on June 1. Airline strike. In San Diego until the 3rd. Closed another sale. June 4 wake

up in Denver in Mom's house. Met with pastor, landlady, banker. June 5 cooked. June 6 hosted wake. June 7 funeral. June 10 left empty, very clean house driving Dad's car to Boston. Long month, worth remembering.
