Vincentian Meditation

As Catholics, it can be easy to get discouraged by decline. Churches are closing. Faith practice is diminishing. Catholics are leaving the faith.

Frederic Ozanam lived in a similar reality in Paris after the religious turmoil of the French Revolution. But Frederic discerned the will of God, trusted in divine providence, and founded the Society of St. Vincent de Paul with six of his confreres.

The first twenty-seven years of the Society were marked by extraordinary growth. Between 1833 and 1860, the Society grew from seven members in Paris to a worldwide movement, with 2,500 conferences and 50,000 members. The Society now has 800,000 members in over 150 countries!

There are 3,400 Vincentians right here in the Archdiocese of St. Louis. Imagine the power! Each Vincentian, each conference, is a potential engine of renewal for the Society and the Church.

Inspired by the theme of our recent Spring Assembly, let us “always give witness” to our faith and to Christ!

The Unaffordability of Housing

As Vincentians, we daily encounter Neighbors in Need who struggle to retain the housing that they have. *Out of Reach 2021*, a publication of the National Low Income Housing Coalition (NLIHC), examines why even modest housing

remains out of reach for low-income workers.

NLIHC defines the “Housing Wage” as the full-time hourly wage a household must earn to afford a modest rental home at HUD’s Fair Market Rent (FMR) while spending no more than 30% of their income on housing costs. Nationally, the 2021 Housing Wage was \$24.90 per hour for a modest 2-bedroom rental and \$20.40 per hour for a modest 1-bedroom rental.

Astoundingly, 11 of the 20 largest occupations in the U.S. pay less than the housing wage. Full-time workers in these occupations must, on average, spend more than 30% of their wages—often far more—to rent a modest apartment.

Introducing John Doyle, Manager Vincentian Data


