

A Eucharist Message from Fr. Dan Thiess -

We are a Eucharistic Community

Eucharist

The New Testament was originally written in the Greek language and the Greek noun εὐχαριστία (*eucharistia*), means "thanksgiving".

THANKS-GIVING

Traditionally during the month of November, we set aside the fourth Thursday to Give Thanks.

All of us most likely have a favorite food or a family recipe for stuffing or mashed potatoes. What kind of turkey do you like?

When we sit at table this year, I invite us all as Vincentians to say grace and pray together as part of our vocation: "Bless us O' Lord and these thy gifts which we are about to receive from thy bounty through Christ our Lord. Amen."

"Jesus was a "foodie."

In scripture we find Jesus and food intertwined in so many passages.

In the Gospel of Matthew 14:15-18

As evening approached, the disciples came to him and said, "this is a remote

place, and it is already getting late. Send the crowds away, so that they can go to the villages and buy themselves some food." Jesus replied, they do not need to go away. You give them something to eat." "We have here only five loaves and two fish, "Bring them here to me," he said. He directed the people to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then he gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the people. They all ate and were satisfied."

At the Last Supper and in the Eucharistic Prayers at Mass:

"He took bread and gave you thanks and praise. He broke the bread and said: "Take this all of you and eat it: this is my body which will be given up for you." When Supper was ended, he took the cup. Again he gave you thanks and praise, gave the cup to his disciples, and said: "Take this all of you and drink from it."

We too are Divinely Inspired as we rely on the Providence of God to provide for us as a Eucharistic Community Giving Thanks.

Let us Give Thanks for each other, for our neighbors and these thy gifts which we are about to receive.

Happy Eucharist! Happy Thanks-Giving!

Updates & Resources

Vouchers - What You Need to Know

Reminders:

- Blue Bed Vouchers may no longer be issued to Neighbors in Need.
- White Thrift Vouchers may no longer be issued to Neighbors in Need.
- Blue and White Vouchers given to Neighbors before November 1 can still be redeemed in the stores.

New Beds for the Bed Program:

The new rolled "bed-in-a-bag" will soon be available to our neighbors! As soon as they are in-stock, we will send an email. Until then, we will continue to provide Neighbors with promo twin and full beds.

Delivery Fee:

Delivery fees for Conferences will be \$125 if they elect to pay for delivery without a Delivery Voucher.

Voucher Updates:

- New bed vouchers are being distributed to District Presidents no later than November 10.
- Donated Goods Vouchers are being distributed to District Presidents no later than November 10. Conferences will incur NO COST for the use of these vouchers. As a reminder, each voucher can be written for a maximum of \$250, and each household can receive a maximum of \$500 in donated goods.
- Delivery Voucher Coupons will be distributed to District Presidents no later than November 10.
- Neighbors must present the voucher(s) and identification at the time of voucher redemption.
- We ask that Vincentians NOT redeem vouchers on behalf of their Neighbors.

Gift Cards:

- Conferences may purchase SVdP Gift Cards at the stores to give to Neighbors. These gift cards can be used on new or donated items. They can also be used for delivery.
- Neighbors can use the cards more than once and at multiple SVdP Thrift stores until the entire amount on the card is spent.
- The Council will no longer invoice Conferences for items purchased. All items should be acquired with the new vouchers or by gift cards.

Reporting:

New, improved tracking should allow for more timely reporting of voucher activity. For the new vouchers, we will track the voucher number, Conference of origin, and cost of goods received. We will share this information monthly.

Rx Outreach: Free/Affordable Mailed Prescriptions

Prescription Assistance from St. Vincent de Paul St. Louis has been discontinued for the time



being, however there are additional resources available to help our Neighbors!

Rx Outreach provides free and affordable medications to uninsured and underinsured people in all 50 states. They mail medications directly to your home. Rx Outreach carries about 1,000 medications for over 60 chronic diseases. You can <u>search by brand/generic name or by health condition</u>.

They are a fully licensed and accredited pharmacy and have helped people save over \$1B on their prescriptions



11/28 - Memorial of St. Catherine Laboure

St. Catherine Laboure was born May 2, 1806 in Fain-lès-Moutiers, France. When she was nine years old, her mother died, and she looked to the Blessed Virgin Mary to be her mother.

She entered the Daughters of Charity on April 21, 1830.

While still a novice, the Virgin Mary appeared to

Catherine and asked her to have a medal struck in her honor. Because of the many miracles that resulted from devotion to it, it became known as the "Miraculous Medal."

Catherine Laboure was canonized in 1947, and is known as the patroness of seniors.

Promote a Path to Financial Independence

Remove the Penalties for Work

During the last session of the Missouri General Assembly, Vincentians rallied

in support of benefits cliff legislation, and SB 45/90 and SB 106 were passed subject to appropriation. If funded, these bills will allow recipients of TANF and SNAP to receive reduced benefits as their income increases, rather than being cut off altogether. Without the threat of a complete loss of benefits, low-income workers will be encouraged to accept a promotion or pay raise or to work longer hours.

But for this to happen, the General Assembly must include funding in the FY 2025 budget. That process starts with the Governor, who is currently working on the budget he will submit to the General Assembly for consideration in January.

Please contact Governor Parson's office and ask him to include funding for the benefits cliff legislation in his proposed budget.

Protect WIC and Housing Vouchers from Cuts

Now that a House Speaker has been elected, the appropriations process has restarted. Congress has until November 17 to agree on funding or face a partial government shutdown.

According to the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities, proposed bills would result in approximately 8,000 Missouri moms and young children being turned away from WIC and an additional 62,800 in Missouri experiencing sharp cuts to their fruit and vegetable benefits.

Likewise, it will be crucial to ensure HUD's affordable housing and homelessness programs receive the highest possible funding since nationwide only one in four households eligible for rental assistance receive it Please contact your Senators and Representative to ensure that anti-poverty programs like WIC and housing vouchers are fully funded.
