

## Fiscal Year '24 Budget Impacts Bring Changes at St. Louis Council, Conferences and Stores

Dear Vincentians,

On Thursday, September 28, the Board approved the Budget for Fiscal Year 2024 after its review and recommendation by the SVdP Finance Committee. To achieve a balanced budget, there are some changes necessary at Conferences and in the Council that will impact FY24.

#### Why the changes?

There are four main reasons for the necessary changes:

- Decreased/spent Bequest Funds
- 2. Understanding the Reality of Voucher Impact and Credits on Thrift Store Sales
- Navigating the Ongoing Effects of Covid on SVdP
- Rising Demand of Neighbor Needs

## Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)



#### What help is available?

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) may be able to help you pay your home energy bills through:

- Energy Assistance A one-time payment for one fuel type for your heating or cooling costs from October-September.
- Energy Crisis Intervention Program (ECIP) Helps pay your energy bill
  when you have a sudden, unexpected, uncontrollable loss of financial
  resources, life-threatening situation, or if there is any circumstance that
  threatens your stability if energy aid is not supplied. The amount of help
  you receive is based on the amount of money needed to settle your crisis
  with the energy provider.

#### Who is eligible?

You may be eligible for help if you:

- Are responsible for paying the utilities for your home (including if you rent)
- Are a Missouri resident

- Are a United States citizen (or have been legally admitted for permanent residence)
- Have \$3,000 or less in your bank accounts, retirement accounts, or investments
- Meet or are below the income guidelines for your household size

#### Safeguarding Requirements for Vincentian Members

Society of St. Vincent De Paul Archdiocesan Council (SVdP) seeks to ensure that, not only is abuse prevented and reported, but also works to create safe and respectful environments to protect the human dignity and confidentiality of our Neighbors-in-Need. Whether we visit with Neighbors or provide support for our conferences, as Vincentians it is important to know how to report abuse and support the Archdiocesan Code of Ethics.



#### Requirements:

All <u>NEW</u> Active and Associate Conference members must complete the Archdiocese Safe Environment Training Program within 14 days of joining a Conference and comply with the Archdiocesan updating requirements.

<u>Current</u> Active and Associate Conference members who have not yet completed the Archdiocese Safe Environment Training Program must do so before November 1, 2023, and report the relevant completion dates to their Conference President and the Council Office who will ensure the information is entered into the Member ServWare page.

The Training Program is all online and will take approximately two hours to complete.


